Important information from the JCQ (Joint Council for Qualifications) and its awarding body members (AQA, CCEA, OCR, Pearson and WJEC)

The 2019 timetable has a new feature – a contingency day on 26 June 2019.

This will be used if a significant, unexpected event arises nationally or locally during the exam period such that no students (or a large number of them) are able to take an exam when planned.

The awarding bodies will liaise with the qualification regulators and the DfE to agree the most appropriate option for managing the impact. As a last resort the affected examinations will be rescheduled. Although every effort would be taken to keep the impact to a minimum, it is possible that there could be more than one timetable date affected following the disruption, up to and including the contingency day on 26 June 2019. Centres will be alerted if it was agreed to reschedule the examinations and the affected candidates will be expected to make themselves available in such circumstances.

Where candidates choose not to be available for the rescheduled examination(s) for reasons other than those traditionally covered by special consideration, they will not be eligible for enhanced grading arrangements.

Of course, we all hope there won't be such disruption and that the contingency day won't be needed. But students should be available throughout the exam period, including on that day, in case their planned timetable is disrupted.
